



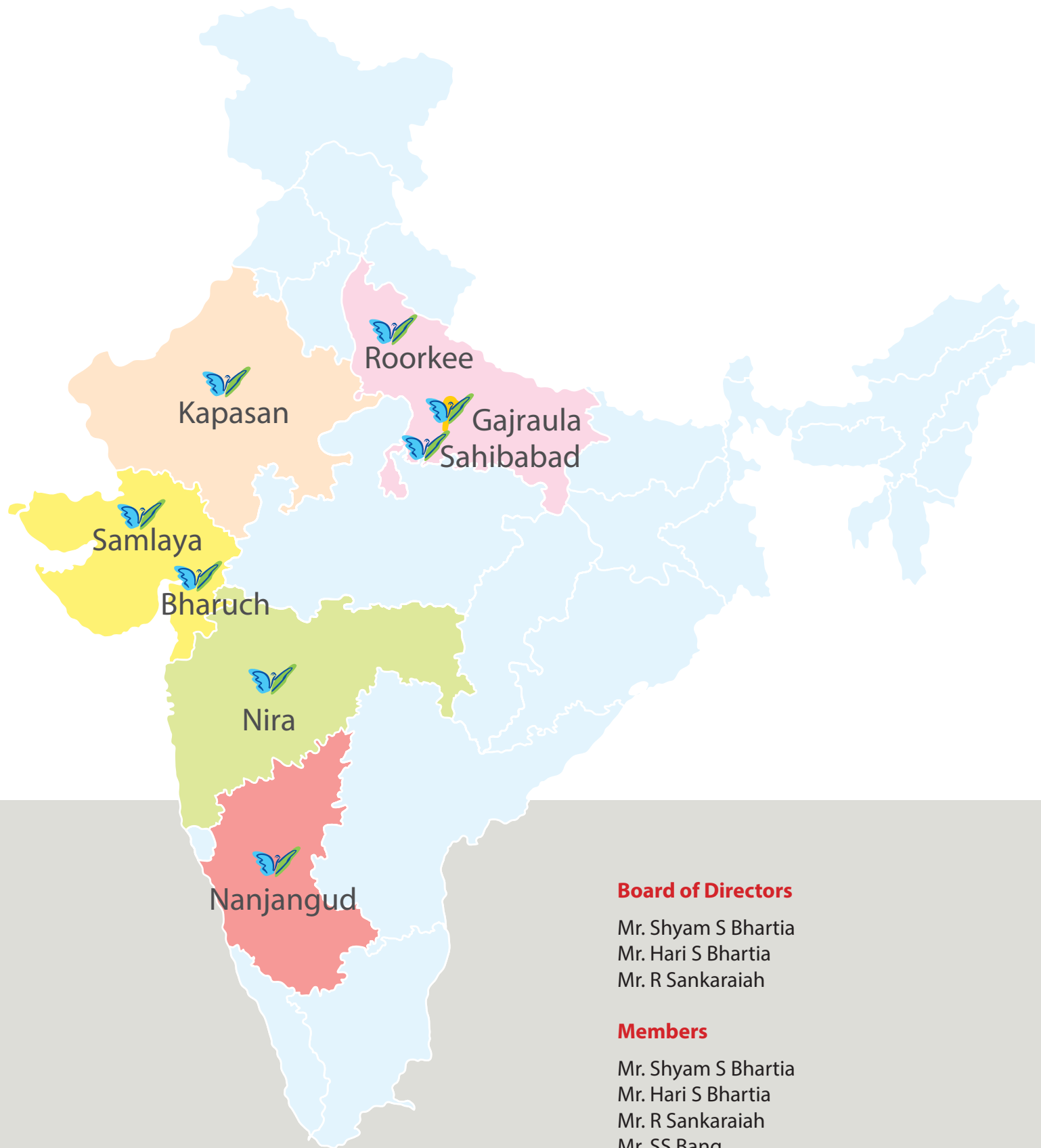

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DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE



Jubilant Bhartia Foundation (JBF) was setup as not for profit organization under section 25 of the Companies Act; in 2007, with the mission 'to develop multi-stakeholder sustainable models to bring about a social change involving knowledge generation & sharing, experiential learning and entrepreneurial ecosystem'.

The Foundation is active in the realm of primary schooling in rural areas, provision of basic health care, vocational training and promoting social enterprises in India. At JBF we are committed to bring in a progressive social change through multi stakeholder engagement. We have adopted a Public, Private, People, Partnership (4P) model for all our work. Through our consistent approach we are now reaching 64 villages covering 3.5 lacs of population.

The Foundation initiated the project '**Muskaan**' in 2007 for the effectiveness of Government Primary Schools in rural areas. 'Muskaan' is an attempt towards bringing all stakeholders - villagers, teachers, students, Panchayati Raj Institution members, local authorities aboard for understanding to improve the learning environment in the school and to improve the quality of education imparted. JBF is working with 100

rural government primary schools benefitting over 13,500 children through 'Muskaan'

The Foundation initiated the project 'Aarogya' and continues to work towards supplementing the healthcare services for the community in the project villages. The Foundation is catering to 64 villages and reaching out to 3.5 lacs population across all the locations through preventive and curative health services. Jubilant is also piloting developing affordable Primary Health Care centers in the rural setup, an example of self sustainable social enterprise developed through CSR funding.

Under the project '**Nayee Disha**', JBF conducts skill development programs at the Vocational Training Centers (VTC) at different locations aimed at helping the trainees find 'vocation for life' on successful completion. The VTCs have the capacity to train around 2000 candidates in a year which would further enhanced in future. This year alone, we have been able to positively touch around 1800 lives. Project '**Samriddhi**' at Kapasan and Gajraula promotes best agricultural practices through various Crop Nutrition, Crop Growth and Crop protection in the nearby community.

Since past three years, Jubilant Bhartia Foundation in collaboration with the Schwab Foundation for Social Entrepreneurship has been selecting 'Social Entrepreneur of the Year India Awards' to recognize and open up unprecedented international opportunities for social entrepreneurs. Mr Anshu Gupta, Founder Director, Goonj was the winner of the India Social Entrepreneur of the Year 2012 by Hon'ble Chief Minister of Delhi, Smt. Sheila Dikshit at a ceremony. In past few years, we have also started engaging Social Entrepreneurs in our activities. The vocational training centers are one of the examples under which JBF is supporting a social enterprise to make the whole system, self sustainable.

All the interventions are the result of our modest efforts in the last few years. We have concrete plans to expand & intensify our activities for bringing more impact and to contribute towards achieving the national goal of Inclusive Growth.

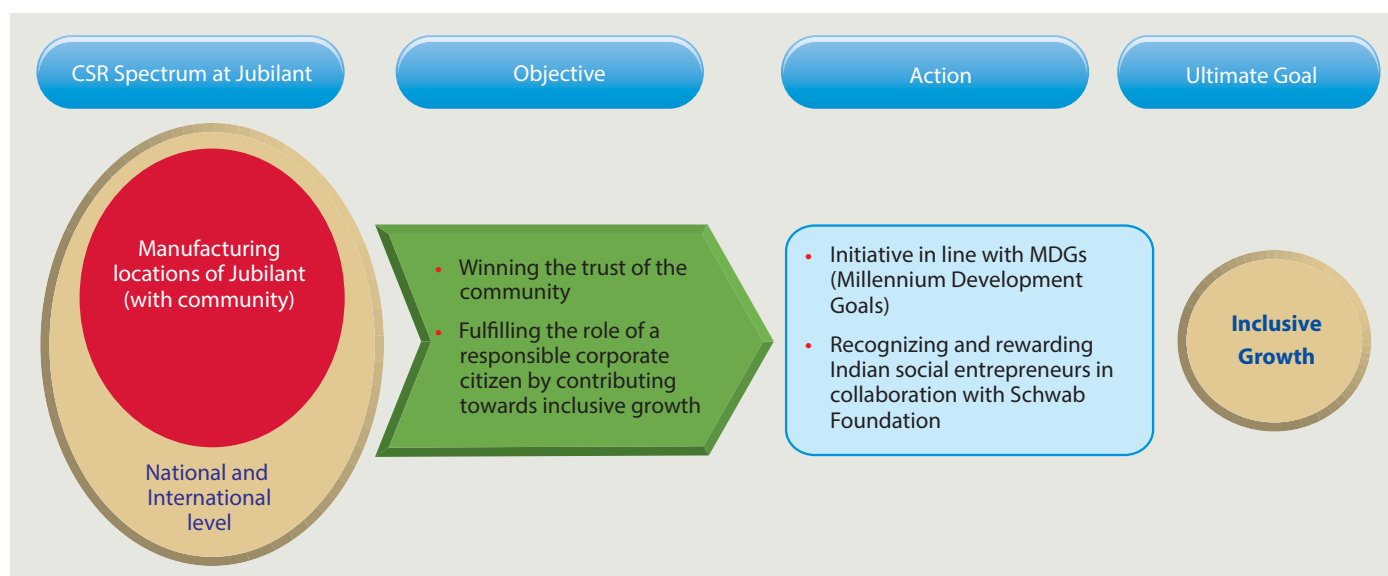

Initiatives towards Empowering Communities

Supporting Rural Govt. Primary Education

The Foundation initiated the Project 'Muskaan' in 2007 for the effectiveness of Government Primary Schools in rural areas. 'Muskaan' is an attempt towards bringing all stakeholders - villagers, teachers, students, Panchayati Raj Institution members, local authorities aboard for understanding the importance of education. Project Muskaan was initiated with the following basic objectives –

- To improve the learning environment in the school so that students feel interested to attend school, thereby bringing down the dropout rates.
- To improve the quality of education imparted and motivate the students to take up higher studies.

JBF is reaching to around 13,500 children of rural government primary schools through 'Muskaan'

Providing Basic Healthcare

JBF continued working towards supplementing the healthcare services for the community around the manufacturing locations of Jubilant. The key initiatives are as below:

Community Health Services – The basic healthcare services are rendered to the community through a static medical clinic, JBF Medical Centre at Gajraula location.

The centre provides various services to the patients as Outpatient Department (OPD), Day Care, Lab Tests, and Directly Observed Treatment, Short course (DOTS) for Tuberculosis, Integrated Counseling and Testing Centre (ICTC), X-Ray etc. At other locations the basic healthcare services are provided to the inmates through mobile health units.

'Nirog Bachpan' – This is a special health check up drive for students under the project 'Muskaan'. A regular health scan of these students is performed by a doctor at all locations.

Swasthya Prahari – JBF is operating a project 'Swasthya Prahari' helping to revitalize the existing Maternal and Child Healthcare (MCH) services at Gajraula. The Swasthya Prahari are the women health guards who are identified from the local community around the manufacturing location. They keep a track of expecting & lactating mothers, malnourished children, birth & deaths. They also make home contacts; motivate people for visiting health institutions.

The key objectives of project:

- Monitoring and reducing Birth rate



- Monitoring and reducing IMR (Infant Mortality Ratio)
- Monitoring and increasing Institutional delivery to reduce MMR (Maternal Mortality Ratio)

Livelihood Generation

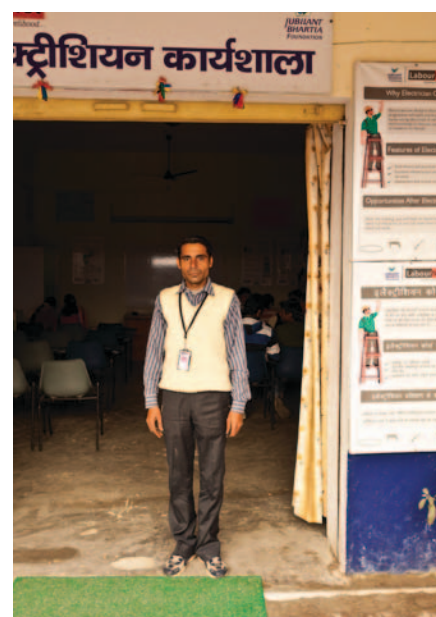
Under the project "Nayee Disha", JBF conducts skill development programs at the Vocational Training Centers (VTC) at different locations aimed at helping the trainees find 'vocation for life' on successful completion. The training programs on a wide array of areas like mobile & tractor repairing, stitching, retail management, soft skill development and beautician courses, offer the right mix of 'class room' and 'hands on' training for optimum results, besides entrepreneurial training & skills. The VTCs have the capacity to train around 2000 candidates in a year which would further enhanced in future. This year alone, we have been able to positively touch around 1800 lives.

'Project Samridhi'

The Company had launched 'Project Samridhi' at Kapasan and Gajraula last year to promote best agricultural practices through various activities. The project is closely linked with the Crop Nutrition, Crop Growth and Crop protection Agri products segment of the Company which has a wide base in the

nearby community by promoting best practices in agriculture and preserving/ Improving soil nutrition.

- At Kapasan 36 field demonstrations were conducted under Corn and Cotton crop in Kharif 2012 has been successfully organized for the farmer's field of Singpur & Narela cluster of Kapasan block in Chittorgarh district. Farmers were trained by the subject expert from ISAP in Singpur. 10 Gobar Gas plants were set up to provide clean bio-gaseous fuel mainly for cooking purposes and also for other applications for reducing use of LPG and other conventional fuels.
- JBF is participating in the National Project on Management of Soil Health and Fertility for Improving soil health and its productivity in the project area (Pratapgarh, Bundi, Chittorgarh, Bhilwara, and Jhalawar in Rajasthan). 5000 samples were tested during the year.
- Setting up of Artificial Insemination Centre for cattle for identification and training of youth from the community on para-vet services and procurement of equipment for providing services to the community members.
- Cattle health camps were organized at Kapasan and Gajraula in the





community where in a veterinary doctor examined the health of the livestock of the community. Suitable vaccinations, medicines and consultation are provided wherever necessary.

- A Kisaan Gosthi was organised jointly at Gajraula where farmers from villages Chaubara, Navada, Chhoya were invited for the training cum Gosthi. 3 Senior Scientists from IVRI-Iijat Nagar came to address the

various veterinary problems. More than 170 people participated in this training.

Social Entrepreneur of the Year Awards

The Jubilant Bhartia Foundation (JBF) has forged four-year collaboration with the Schwab Foundation for Social Entrepreneurship, to recognize and open up unprecedented international opportunities for social entrepreneurs. The India Social Entrepreneur of the Year

Award aims to identify and celebrate visionary social entrepreneurs who have demonstrated large-scale, systems-change models and are at the stage of scaling/replicating their ideas across India and in other countries. This year the award ceremony was held on **6 November 2012** at Delhi Mr Anshu Gupta, Founder Director, Goonj was conferred as the winner of the India Social Entrepreneur of the Year 2012 by Hon'ble Chief Minister of Delhi, Smt. Sheila Dikshit at the ceremony.

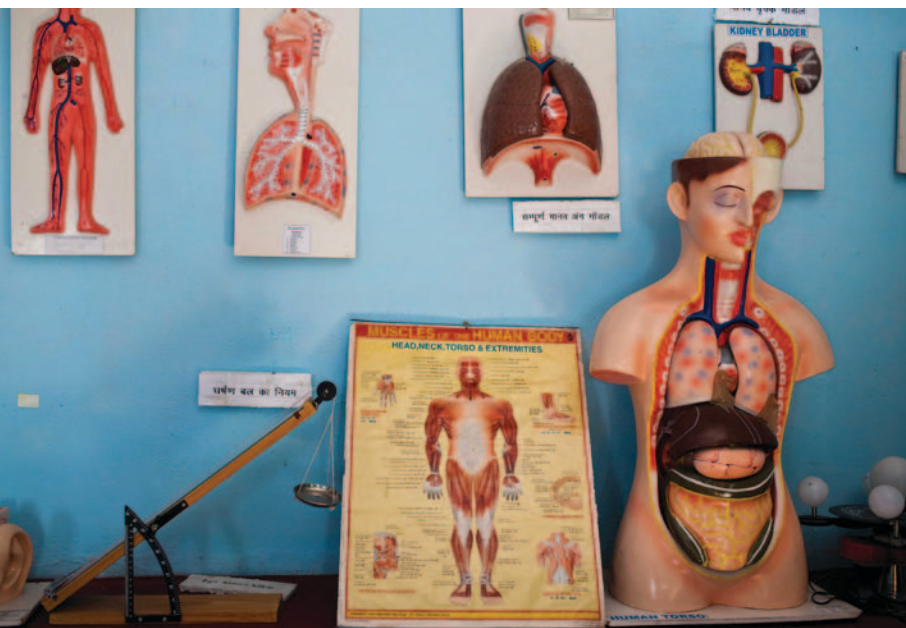


At Gajraula in UP, the project 'Muskaan' reached to 7769 students across 55 Rural Government Primary School.

Regular Village Education meetings were organized in the schools which witnessed the participation of around 300 members.

2 teachers training sessions were organized for the capacity building of teachers while Village Education Committee meeting was organized regularly on a monthly basis.

Regular Annual Day, Sports Day, Cultural and Co curricular activities were organized throughout the year.

Sulthanther is the first school where JBF embarked its first Muskaan initiative. The success of this initiative has been possible with the support and dedication of people like Chandra Pal Singh sir, who have selflessly devoted themselves to the cause. It's a very proud moment for JBF, as this recognition motivates everyone associated with project Muskaan to push the limits and take project Muskaan to newer heights. HEALTH

Strengthening basic healthcare facilities

Jubilant had initiated community healthcare services in 1980s at Gajraula in UP at a modest scale in association with the Sarvajanic Medical Trust. These facilities were upgraded to a full-fledged Community Health centre in 1988. Through sincere and hard work of the staff, the Centre has earned trust of the local community and today it serves 150 – 200 patients per day. In addition, Jubilant also carries out community healthcare services through mobile dispensaries at Gajraula. In the FY a total population of 2.5 lacs is catered through JBF medical centre while 1 lac is covered through project Swasthya Prahari.

More than 6000 patients were screened at General OPD at SMC against different health ailments which included common diseases viz. fever, vomiting, nausea, itching and also the Mother and Child Health care (MCH) related issues. Various Community Health Programs/camps

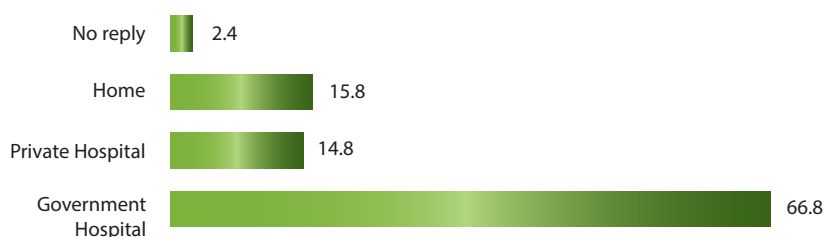
like Pulse Polio, HIV/AIDS Awareness generation, Dental Care, Physiotherapy training, Cardio Check up, Blood Donation, First Aid Training etc were carried out for the community throughout the year.

ICTC & DOTS

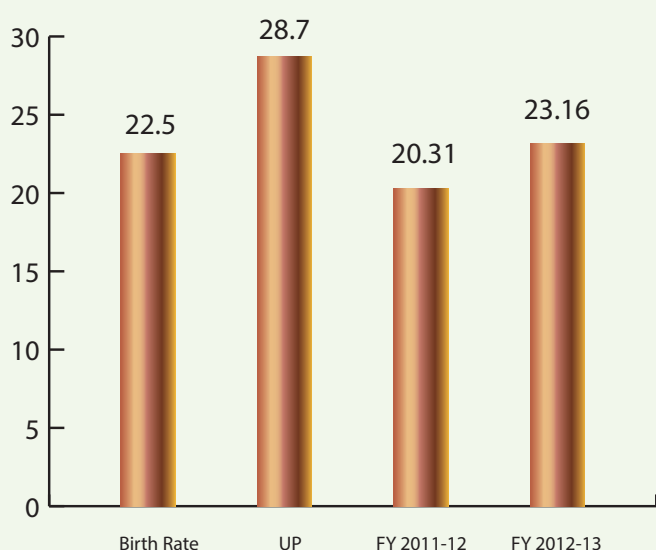
JBF is running an Integrated Counseling and Testing Centre (ICTC) for HIV/AIDS in association with UP State AIDS Control Society (UPSACS) at Gajraula. It has a tie up with the Anti Retroviral Treatment Centre at the Medical College in nearby town of Meerut, where the patients found positive are referred. Qualified Doctor, Councilors and Laboratory technicians operate this centre. During the year 2012-13 the ICTC referred 4 patients for Antiretroviral Therapy (ART) in Meerut, UP. The theme World AIDS day for the year 2012 was "GETTING TO ZERO". The theme suggests that awareness should be taken to the level that the people get aware and the cases of AIDS drop to zero. Taking cognizance of the theme, the World AIDS day was also observed at the locations



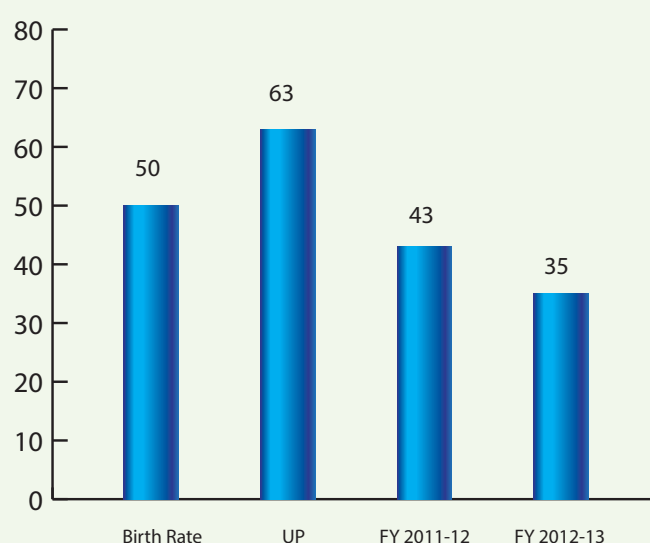
Preferred Location for Child Birth

Swasthya Prahari

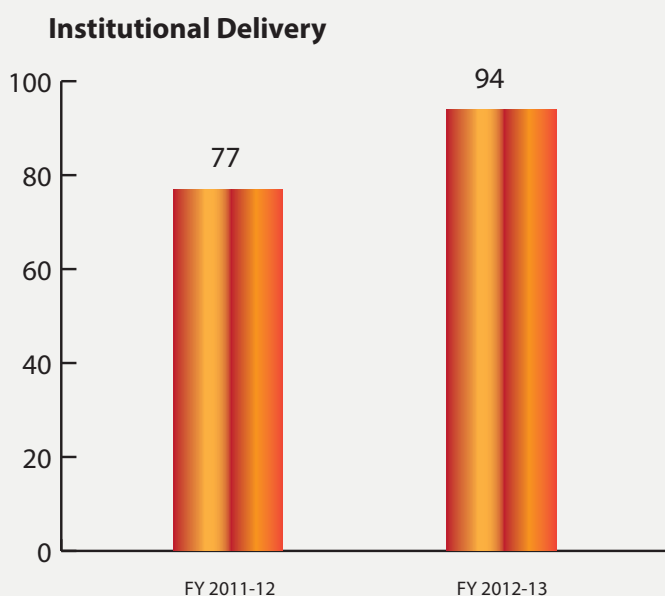
JBF is operating a Project 'Swasthya Prahari' helping to revitalize the existing Maternal and Child Healthcare (MCH) services at Gajraula. The Swasthya Praharis are the women Health Guards who are identified from the local community around the manufacturing location. They keep track of expecting & lactating mothers, malnourished children, birth & deaths. They also make home contacts; motivate people for visiting health institutions and promote institutional delivery of the child.

The key objectives of project:

- Monitoring and reducing Birth rate
- Monitoring and reducing IMR (Infant Mortality Ratio)
- Monitoring and increasing Institutional delivery to reduce MMR (Maternal Mortality Ratio)

There has been a significant increase in the institutional delivery after the inception of the project curbing IMR and MMR. Earlier due to lack of awareness and existing taboos, the community was practicing delivery of child at home which is an unsafe practice leading to IMR and MMR. The institutional delivery taken place by the registered medical practitioner assures safe motherhood and child delivery.

As per the report on Social Impact Assessment of CSR Initiatives of Jubilant in Gajraula, UP (carried by Partners in Change) 66.8% of respondents would like to go to government hospitals, whereas 15.8% preferred home and 14.8% of the respondents would like to go to private doctors for child birth.



- IMR & Birth rate in Project area is below Uttar Pradesh average
- Various initiative to reduce the same and bring it below National average
- Ambulance services for pickup and drop for institutional delivery
- Promoting institutional Delivery, Immunisation and Growth Monitoring of children

LIVELIHOOD

The Foundation has established Vocational Training Centre at Gajraula. The foundation has identified some skills, based on need assessment studies. Some of the skills identify are repairing electrical/ electronic appliances and mobile phones, beautician and hair dressing, tailoring, repairing of tractors, diesel engines, threshers, two-wheelers etc. All the interventions aim at increasing employability of the community. 598 youths were imparted vocational training under 9 vital trades under Nayee Disha project in Gajraula, U.P. Of these 121 youths were employed/self employed.

Project Samriddhi: An Initiative for Sustainable Agriculture Practice

'Project Samriddhi' was launched for the community in vicinity at Gajraula to promote best practices in agriculture. Under the initiative Kishan Goshti was organised where farmers from villages Chaubara, Navada, Chhoya were invited for the training cum Gosthi. 3 Senior Scientists from IVRI-Ijhat Nagar came to address the various veterinary problems of which the major ones were need of immunization in cattle, communicable diseases in cattles and how to derive profit with judicious use of cattle. More than 170 people participated in this training and asked different questions on agriculture as well as cattle health from all the speakers.

A Cattle Health Camps are also organized at Gajraula in the community where in a veterinary doctor examines the health of the livestock of the community. Suitable vaccinations, medicines and consultation are provided wherever necessary.



Nanjangud



EDUCATION

Project 'Muskan' reach to 9 primary schools and 6 junior schools covering 1036 students at Nanjangud in Karnataka. Throughout the year JBF facilitated several programs to enhance the quality of education of students like environment day celebrations, Read India program, observing significant days, Birthday celebrations etc. All the programs ensured the participation of Education department, SDMC, School administration and participation of village leaders and gram panchayat members. Infrastructure support was provided to some schools in the form of drinking water facility and toilet facilities.



8 schools under the project Muskaan at Nanjangu were awarded under various categories at "Environment Friendly School" Award Function (Parisara Mitra Shale) organized by Karnataka Pollution Control Board on 28 March 2013. The students were felicitated with cash and certificates as prizes.

Project 'Muskaan' shone with another gem in its gamut when a school under the project was conferred with a prestigious award by the Education Department of Karnataka Government in the year 2012-13. The best school award was given to Byalaru School at Nanjangud, Mysore District, Karnataka.

HEALTH

JBF is providing basic health services through mobile dispensary in 7 villages of Nanjangud consulting approximately 45000 patients in the year 2012-13.

Along with these services through mobile clinic, dental care and eye care camp were also organized.

World AIDS day was observed at the location with an awareness program for the community members.

The school health checkup camp screened more than 1000 students during the year.



LIVELIHOOD

JBF has established a Vocation Training Centre, VTC at Nanjangud which is being operated by engaging a social enterprise "Labour Net" to improve the quality of training and make the vocational training centre self sustainable.

A total of 1011 candidates were provided training under various trades including Beauty & Hair Care, Carpentry, Electrician, Masonry - Plumbing Tailoring, WPS and Sales.

EDUCATION



Project 'Muskan', continues to spread smiles across 8 rural primary schools covering 1336 students at Samlaya. The new joiners at Muskaan schools were felicitated by JBF at Samlaya on School Pravetsotsav. The celebration aims at motivating students in the presence of community members. The students were given school bag and stationery items.

Regular VEC & parent teacher meetings were organized throughout the year to focus more on the quality of education being imparted and the increased involvement of parents in the education of their child. Tree plantation, drawing competition and other cultural activities were organized at regular intervals throughout the year.

HEALTH



JBF is operating 3 weekly OPD clinics in the three nearby villages mainly, Karchiya, Juna Samlaya, Paswa covering around 15000 patients against different health ailments like fever, vomiting, nausea, itching and mother and child health issues. 'Nirog Bachpan' – the school health checkup program was organized at all Muskaan schools on a regular basis. The children were examined and those requiring treatment were prescribed medicines.

LIVELIHOOD



At Samlaya, during the year 2012-13, women were trained on skills which would lead to their economic empowerment.

- 30 women were provided training on Beautician course under Rural Entrepreneur Development program
- 15 women trainees were provided training on Agarbatti making.
- 15 women trainees received training on candle making.



Bharuch

EDUCATION



JBF has started implementing the CSR activities at Bharuch one of the manufacturing locations and catering to villages Vilayat, Bhersem and Vorasamani. Project Muskaan reaches out to 4 schools covering 843 students here. During the year various activities were facilitated by JBF including educational tour to science city at Ahmedabad, Celebrating important days of National significance like Independence and Republic Day at Muskaan Schools along with other competitions like heena decoration and kite flying.

HEALTH



An eye checkup camp was organized at Bharuch where 204 patients were screened and 54 patients were provided spectacles and 18 patients were referred to a SEWA Rural Hospital for the operation. Community members from villages- Villayat, Bhersem, Vora Samni, Argama, Vasi, and Vagra participated in the camp

RO Plant at Bharuch

JBF has supported Community in establishing an RO water plant at Bharruch for safe drinking water. The equipment and setting up of plant cost has been borne by JBF where in the infrastructure support and management support is being provided by Gram Panchayat. The project is self sustainable as per 20 litre bottle of water is being provided to the inmates at the cost of Rs 5. The total amount goes in to the administrative and maintenance cost of the RO plant.

LIVELIHOOD



JBF initiated a Rakhi Making Project at Bharuch for women Self Help Group for its self sustenance. 8 candidates were provided initial training and information on raw material procurement was provided by JBF. The forward linkage was also provided by JBF where in the women are getting orders from the market. The prices are defined depending on the intricacy of work done and kind of rakhis. A group leader has been identified in the SHG for procurement and marketing linkage. It is a typical case where an idea and way forward has been provided by JBF along with a little training support. The result is self dependent women.



Kapasan



EDUCATION

At Kapasan, 5 schools are being supported under project Muskan benefitting 567 students. Major activities which are implemented under the project to meet out the outlined objectives are as below:

Strengthening basic infrastructure as per the requirement of schools like construction of toilets, painting, construction of school boundaries.

Organization of various extracurricular activities like eco club, exposure visit, cultural and sports activities, birthday celebrations of students, felicitation of students' teachers and parents.

Regularization of Village Education committee and participation of parents in the committee

HEALTH

At Kapasan, healthcare facilities are provided to community members by JBF through following activities:

Community and Family Health Camps- Regular health camps are organized to observe the health irregularities amongst the community members and suitable referral services are provided to check the observed ailments. The camps were organized in consultation with Government Primary Health Centre at the respective locations.

School Health Check up program: In consultation with Government Primary Health Centre at Kapasan, special school health checkup programs are organized for Muskan students with the help of primary health care center.

Nira



EDUCATION



A total of 9 Schools are supported under project Muskaan (SADAFULI at Nira) covering 1296 students.

Under the project the major activities facilitated during the year are regular health checkup of students, blood group identification, school library development, sport competition, art competition, annual day celebration, infrastructure support as per requirement, eco club, VEC meeting, teachers training, puppet show, plantation in the campus by teachers & students, Infrastructure support was provided to the school by provision of safe drinking water and renovation of school walls.

HEALTH



JBF is providing medical service to the community at Laxminagar, Nimbut & ward no 6, Nira. Around 10,000 populations are covered under basic health care programme at the location.

Besides, health camps like pediatric checkup, eye checkup, women general health checkup, hemoglobin checkup, cattle health care camp are organized all round the year.

LIVELIHOOD



During the year a total of 59 candidates received vocational training through JBF at Nira.

20 candidates were trained for tailoring while 39 were provided Soft Skill training with modules on Computer learning, Spoken English & Personality Development.

On the lines of other locations, JBF is about to establish a vocational training centre at Nira in association with a social enterprise with a capacity to train 500 candidates in a year.



Roorkee



EDUCATION

At Roorkee, JBF is implementing Muskaan project at 1 school reaching to 262 children. Under the project following activities were held through the year 2012-13:

- Parent Teacher meetings
- Birthday celebration
- Republic Day celebration
- Painting & pictorial lesson on the wall
- Prize distribution programme (Winners of sports competition)
- Distribution of sports and recreation item.
- Distribution of teaching aids
- Eco Club activity- Kitchen garden
- Furniture for classroom

Besides, a Non Formal Education (NFE) Centre (Muskaan Talim Kendra) at Roorkee is established by JBF for promoting quality education among the girl students who became a school dropout due to cultural and other non-monetary factors. The NFE centre aims to provide out-of-school children with opportunities for alternative primary education imparted at a convenient place, pace and time.

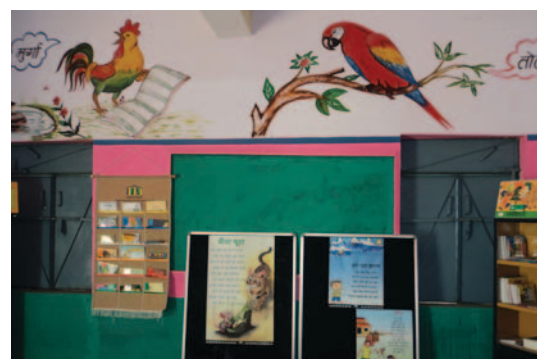
HEALTH

Swasthya Prahari Program- JBF has planned to initiate "Swasthya Prahari", the MCH program at Makhnapur Village in Roorkee. Taking the plan forward a Gram Swasthya samiti (GSS) of 12 members has been formed and regular meetings on health issues were conducted during the year. A "Swasthya Prahari Didi" has been identified by JBF to facilitate and carry out the activities in project Village. Under the program, immunization schedule as well weight measurement were held along with home visits, birth & death registration, registration of pregnant and lactating women and infants at Aangan Wadi Centre (AWW) centers.



LIVELIHOOD

During the year 20 candidates were provided training on tailoring in two batches.



Sahibabad



JBF continued with the agenda of holistic development of the Rajkiya Prathmik Vidyalaya, Sahibabad (near Jubilant Industries Limited, Sahibabad) under the Muskaan initiative.

a) Independence Day Celebration

Cultural programmes were organized by the students on 15th August 2012. Patriotic songs, group dance, poem recitation and skit were performed by the students on the occasion of Independence Day. Prizes to the meritorious students were also distributed on that day.

b) Plantation in School Campus

Understanding the importance of greenery, the students planted trees in the school premises and they take care of each plant, water and manure them regularly.

c) Health Check Up & Blood Group Camp

A medical team from Gajraula visited the school for the health check up camp for students. The blood group of the students were also examined and kept for records. A field worker from the Sahibabad village has been identified to coordinate and assist JBF for the day-to-day activities, viz. morning assembly, checking nail and uniform of children, cleanliness of school, maintaining discipline in the school and provide updates to JBF on a regular basis.

d) Utensils for Mid Day Meal

JBF and the community jointly distributed utensils (plates and spoons) for the mid day meal. It was distributed to all the 379 students of the school.

e) Birthday Celebration of students

Management's responsibility for the Financial Statements

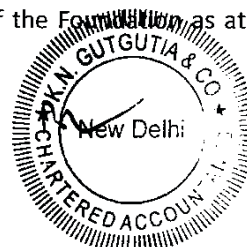

1 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND NOTES TO ACCOUNTS

A. Basis of Preparation & Presentation of Financial Statements

The accounts of the Company are prepared under the historical cost convention on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India ("GAAP") and comply with the mandatory accounting standards notified under the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006, as amended, and with the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 1956. The financial statements are presented in Indian rupees rounded off to the nearest thousand.

During the year ended March 2012, the revised Schedule VI notified under the Companies Act, 1956 has become applicable to the Company for presentation of its financial statements. The revised Schedule VI has a significant impact on the presentation and disclosures made in the financial statements. The Company has also reclassified the previous year figures in accordance with the requirements applicable in the current year.

All assets and liabilities have been classified as current or non-current as per the Company's normal operating cycle and other criteria set out in the revised Schedule VI to the Companies Act, 1956. Based on the nature of products and the time between the acquisition of assets for processing and their realisation in cash and cash equivalents, the Company has ascertained its operating cycle as 12 months for the purpose of current – non current classification of assets and liabilities.

B. Fixed Assets & Depreciation

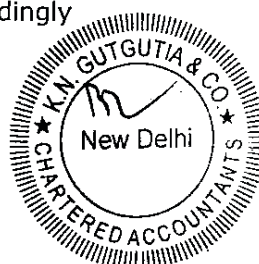
Fixed Assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation.

The company depreciates equipment over the estimated useful life using the straight-line method. The estimated useful life of office equipments, Computers and ambulance is at 3 years and for lab equipments it is at 5 years. In respect of additions during the year, depreciation has been charged from the date of purchase.

The depreciation rates as mentioned above are higher than rates specified in the Schedule XIV of the Indian Companies Act, 1956.

2. Employee Benefits.

Employee benefits includes like salaries, wages, compensated absences, incentive etc. and are recognized as expenses in the period in which the employee renders the related services and measured accordingly






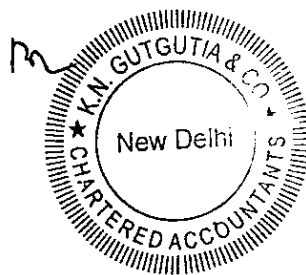
